b. Solid Waste

The minutes of December 5th, 2023 Solid Waste Management Technical Committee and the solid waste report for March 2024 were circulated.

Paul Lang and Isabelle Godin provide a few explanations before moving on to the motion.

Redemption Centres

WHEREAS the Government of New Brunswick has amended the *Designated Materials Regulation* under the *Clean Environment Act* to establish an Extended Producer Responsibility program for beverage containers effective April 1, 2024;

WHEREAS industry brand owners chose Encorp Atlantic to manage the beverage container program and Recycle NB will continue to oversee the program;

WHEREAS as a result of these changes to the law and the agreements submitted by Encorp Atlantic, the Rogersville (Caissie Recycling) and St-Louis-de-Kent (Recyclage Kent Recycling) redemption centres have closed;

WHEREAS due to these closures, residents of Kent North must now travel to the Rexton, Miramichi or Baie-Sainte-Anne redemption centres to obtain refunds on deposit-bearing beverage containers.

WHEREAS the closure of these two redemption centres also represents the loss of two electronics recycling depots in Kent, leaving only four (Baie-Sainte-Anne, Bouctouche, Cocagne and Saint-Antoine) to serve our entire region;

Be it therefore resolved that the Kent Regional Service Commission send a letter to the Minister of the Environment and Local Government, Recycle NB and Encorp Atlantic urging them to find a permanent solution so that residents of Kent North can once again recycle their beverage containers while receiving refunds on deposit-bearing beverage containers close to their home.
